

CALIFORNIA TRANSIT WORKS!

California Transit Works! is a statewide consortium of transit agencies, labor unions, and community colleges that promote High Road_{SM} Training Partnerships (HRTP) to address critical issues in public transit. We are a **national innovator** in the field of transit labor/management workforce development. CTW believes that the highest degree of success in transit workforce development programs begins with a firm foundation of labor-management partnerships that are focused on the frontline worker. We educate, advocate, and advise transit agencies and unions in building Worker Centered training partnerships that address industry demand for qualified workers to provide reliable and effective clean energy transit services.

Over the last seven years, California Transit Works! (CTW), as one of the initial High Road Training Partnership grantees of the California Workforce Development Board (CWDB), has focused on responding to urgent transit industry needs, including:

- The need to recruit and retain frontline workers due to the increasing "silver tsunami", especially from underserved and priority population communities; and
- The demand for new skills training for frontline workers related to the California mandate requiring transit agencies to convert to Zero Emissions Buses (ZEBs) by 2040 (ICT 2040).

CTW provides direct technical assistance to transit agencies and unions in building HRTPs, peer mentoring programs, and registered apprenticeships for maintenance and transportation, as well start-up funding for new HRTP programs. We bring together frontline workers, managers, trainers, and other stakeholders statewide to share innovative approaches and successful programs addressing industry needs. We create spaces for labor, management, community, and educational partners to support one another as a Community of Practice that has expanded beyond California to include transit labor-management partnerships across the United States. As of December 2023:

- More than 200 frontline worker peer mentors (operators and maintenance) are working with 600+ new hires and apprentices in California transit HRTP programs.
- 421 apprentices have graduated from Mission College with credit Certificates of Achievement, while an innovative linked pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship bus operator program at Golden Gate Transit is showing solid success.

CTW is the national workforce development model for the Amalgamated Transit Union (ATU International):

- 98 labor-management partnership sites at various stages of development.
- 125 training programs and apprenticeships.
- More than 1,400 frontline peer mentors nationally.
- CTW's HRTP work is recognized by the White House Advisory Committee on Apprenticeship/US Department of Labor as an excellent example of its own national High Road workforce development vision.
